LOCATION, DESCRIPTION AND ACCREDITATION

Our Lady of Mercy School for Young Women, a Catholic secondary school for grades 6 to 12, is sponsored by the Sisters of Mercy and is nationally accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. The school is located in the Rochester, New York suburb of Brighton, within the Penfield School District. Students who successfully complete the application process join the student body drawn from 38 local area school districts and several different countries. The school educates approximately 800 students in grades 6 to 12.

ADMINISTRATION AND FACULTY

The Mercy administration consists of a President, a Principal, two Vice Presidents, two Assistant Principals, and a Middle School Principal. The faculty consists of 64 certified teachers and four full-time counselors, virtually all of whom have earned Masters' degrees in their disciplines.

CURRICULUM

Mercy's academic program is college preparatory following both national, and college and career readiness standards.

- Honors courses are offered in English, Languages Other Than English (LOTE), mathematics and social studies.
- Advanced Placement courses are offered in Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, English Language, English Literature, European History, French Language, Latin, Physics, Physics 2, Psychology, Spanish Language, Statistics, 3D Studio Arts, US Government and Politics, US History and World History. If a student has an interest in an AP course not offered at Mercy she may have the opportunity to take the course online.
- Dual Credit courses are offered in Accounting, Advanced Microsoft Applications, Calculus, Entrepreneurial Studies, Global Environment, Personal Finance and Principles of Business.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Students are required to earn seven and a half credits in Grades 9 and 10, and a minimum of seven credits in Grades 11 and 12.
- All students are required to take at least one dual credit or Advanced Placement course.
- Grade 12 students enrolled in three or more Advanced Placement courses have the option of taking a minimum of six credits.
- Students must earn credit for four years of English, four years of social studies, four years of mathematics, three years of LOTE, three years of science, four years of theology, and four years (two credits) of physical education.
- Additional elective credits may be used to obtain a minimum of 29 credits.
- All Mercy graduates complete the MOTTO, a Capstone project that allows them to connect their talents, passions and interests through a coordinated effort developing and executing research, service and presentation.

STUDENT ACADEMIC PROFILE

Each year, between 98% and 100% of Mercy graduates go on to higher education. In 2017, 100% of our graduates went on to higher education and earned over \$20 million in scholarship offers.
